

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER FAILURE TO MONITOR

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor your water for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During June 2024 we failed to monitor for the following contaminant(s) and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

### What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the month of June 2024, the required sampling frequency and when the samples should have been taken.

Contaminant	Required sampling frequency	Number of samples taken	When all samples should have been taken	When samples were or will be taken

### What happened? What was done? When will it be resolved?

We failed to conduct required weekly testing the week ending June 1, 2024. Required testing has resumed and all results meet DEP standards. We reported this to DEP and took measures to ensure that this would not happen again.
